

## FISCAL YEAR 2020 TRIBAL HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM NOTICE OF FUNDING OPPORTUNITY (NOFO) KEY CHANGES

## **Increase in Total Available Funds**

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP) was allocated a total of \$15 million, which is a \$5 million increase over the \$10 million allocated in FY 2019.

## **Expanded Number of Eligible Tribes Based on Proximity to an International Border or Coastline**

To be eligible to receive THSGP funding, recipients must be "directly eligible tribes" that meet defined criteria in the THSGP NOFO as set forth in the *Homeland Security Act of 2002*, as amended. Among these eligibility criteria, a tribe can qualify as a directly eligible tribe if it is located on or near an international border or a coastline bordering an ocean or international waters. For FY 2020, tribes located within 100 miles of an international border or a coastline bordering an ocean or international waters satisfy this criterion. Previously, the limit was 50 miles.

## **Bonus for Addressing National Priorities**

Applicants who sufficiently address one or more of the National Priorities outlined below will receive a 20 percent score increase to their investment score (refer to Section E of the FY 2020 THSGP NOFO for additional details). These National Priorities are:

- Enhancing cybersecurity;
- Enhancing the protection of soft targets/crowded places;
- Addressing emerging threats (e.g., transnational criminal organizations, weapons of mass destruction [WMDs], unmanned aerial systems [UASs], etc.).
